My name is Carl Person and I'm the Reform Party candidate for mayor. There's a single reform the NYC mayor could implement to solve the economic problems of disadvantaged youth, underemployed adults and needy families. We need to teach broad-based information technology both to high school seniors (instead of jobless graduations from college and a lifetime of debt), with the same FREE 1-year program for adults, to enable them to get a job anywhere, without licensing or testing, paying \$25 to \$100 per hour, working for or servicing small businesses, professional firms, non-profits and governmental agencies. This would expand small business, local manufacturing, farming and local support services, increase real property values, result in political reform, and eliminate the need for Stop and Frisk. I'm a Harvard Law School graduate, lawyer and businessperson. I created the paralegal field of employment and started up, owned and ran for 18 years a for-profit technical training school with a similar program. Many of NYC's 75,000 public school teachers could teach this program. With my reform, we wouldn't need charter schools. Parents and students would enroll in the public high schools to qualify for high-paying jobs and small business opportunities. This training is needed because of the fast-moving technical advances during the past 16 years. NYC would become the nation's Education Capital.
